WESTERLY BOARD OF TRADE MEETS

Correspondence with Three Prospecting Firms Discussed—Republicans and Democrats Meet in Caucus—Family Moving to Norwich Loses Goods and Money by Theft—Balance of \$50,612 in Segar Estate.

The regular meeting of the Westerly Board of Trade, scheduled for 8 o'clock Tuesday evening, the first to be held during the three-months vacation period, was not called to order until 8:30.

In the absence of the three vice presidents, Eugene B. Pendleton was elected chairman pro tem, and Henry L. Burdick secretary.

Alexander Ferguson, John J. Carney, A. T. L. Ledwidge and Dr. John M. O'Connell were elected to membership.

In correspondence which the secretary has had with a prospecting company in Springfield relative to locating in Westerly, also with a manufacturing firm in Beverly, Mass. also with an English firm for the manufacture of artificial silk, inviting location in Westerly, the good offices of the Board of Trade were offered for each case.

The republican caucus to elect delegates to the state convention, a membership of 25, was held in the town hall on Tuesday evening.

George B. Utter placed in nomination the names of the following as delegates to the state convention: Louis W. Arnold, Albert H. Langworthy, Howard Pember, William Clark, James A. Welch and Walter P. Dixon.

At a caucus to be held next week a candidate for senator and representative from Westerly will be nominated.

John Flynn presided at the democratic caucus and John Donovan was secretary. The town committee was re-elected, as was Andrew Farrell as the Westerly member of the democratic state central committee.

Tristram D. Babcock was unanimously nominated for senator and George P. Cottrell for representative.
