WESTERY QUARRIES COMPANY

Articles of Incorporation Filed—The New Railroad Bridge Over the Pawcatuck River—Sheriff John R. Wilcox Able to Take a Short Ride.

Articles of Incorporation for the Westery Quarries company have been filed with the secretary of state and Judge John W. Sweeney and John J. Dunn of Westery and Melvin A. Henson of Stonington are named as incorporators.

The Westery Quarries company will take over the property of the Sweeney and the Dixon granite quarries, about a quarter of a mile east of the Westery railway station.

After an all day's struggle, the surf men of the Watch Hill and Fishers Tuesday morning succeeded in raising the schooner Grace Seymour, which has lain helpless in Long Island sound for two days.

With several of her sails threshed to ribbons by the terrific blow she met coming up the outside of Long Island sound, the schooner Grace Seymour, bound from Cayton, Conn., to Bridgeport, Conn., with 100,000 feet of hard pine lumber, slipped around the point at 9 o'clock Saturday night.

The three-master was crippled by the loss of her spanker, foremast, flying jib and maintop, and came to anchor in 24 fathoms of water in a comparatively sheltered position.

The schooner was about 4 1/2 miles south of Watch Hill and the two crews made the row in half and three-quarters of an hour respectively.

The Seymour was built in Hadley, Conn., in 1835, and until recently was owned in Barnstable, Mass. Recently she was purchased by New York parties.
