is painful to discuss. One of the best authorities in the city says we should not appropriate a cent for new macadam for two years, but put all the money usually appropriated for new work into repairs of old macadam. Foreign countries are years ahead of us in road building and road maintenance. They keep men constantly on the roads looking for signs of decay. As soon as a road begins to unravel the spot is repaired. It must be cheaper and better to repair the first indications of deterioration and always have the roads in good shape than to wait, as we do, until a road is impassable or full of ruts and gullies and then build a new one.

Now that road making and repairing are being given serious attention, it will doubtless be but a comparatively short time when our American highway commissioners and road builders will decide upon a serviceable and satisfactory method that will not cost too much money. At the present time it is like running money through a sieve, so far as results go.—Bridgeport Post.

Hanging and Life Insurance. The reasoning seems to us to be poor. Mayor McCue probably had no idea of being hanged when he took out the life policy for \$15,000. He may have had the idea even then of killing his wife, but other men have done that very thing and lived to get married again. In fact, there is every reason to believe that McCue had no idea of being hanged. The company when it issued the policy, must have realized that any man may get killed by a train, or shot down by a live wire. The company took the risk. Undoubtedly in getting up the mortality tables those who died by hanging were included in the number of deaths.

It seems that the right to vote is not the only thing which a criminal loses. McCue lost his vote, his life and his insurance. He probably does not care about the \$15,000 now, but his family does, and after all, it was not his family that was hanged, only McCue. However, it is the more impressive we punish. Courts reason very peculiarly sometimes. Perhaps it is
