WARD AND BROWN THE CANDIDATES—HEYDLER REFUSES TO RUN FOR NATIONAL LEAGUE PRESIDENCY—MORE EVIDENCE ON UMPIRE BRIBERY.

New York, Dec. 16.—No president of the National League of professional baseball clubs was elected by the club owners in their five hours session in the Waldorf-Astoria today. The election was taken, and this resulted in four votes each for John M. Ward and Robert W. Brown, the present incumbent, refused to allow his name to be presented as a candidate for re-election.

Fogel Votes for Ward. As was expected, Fogel voted for Ward, who was placed in nomination by Charles H. Ebbets of Brooklyn, seconded by John T. Brush of New York. The other votes received by Ward were those of the New York, Brooklyn and Chicago clubs. Brown heretofore has been considered only in the light of a compromise candidate, but he received the votes of Stanley Robison of St. Louis, Garry Herrmann of Cincinnati, Barney Dreyfus of Pittsburgh and J. S. C. Dovey of Boston.

Heydler Has Not Withdrawn. John Heydler has not by means withdrawn from the presidential race and his name was presented later as that of a candidate. But to determine how the club owners stood toward the applicant, Heydler told Herrmann not to present his name today, and Herrmann complied.

Heydler Supporters Feel Jubilant. The supporters of Heydler, who are Herrmann, Dreyfus and Dreyfus, enthusiastically and Robison, passively were jubilant tonight over the fact that no president was chosen on the first ballot. Charles W. Murphy, president of the Chicago club, said his arrival here last Friday night that Ward would be elected president on the first ballot.
