Hurling down seventy feet through space, the steel supports of a stack on which he was working on the Robinson building on Railroad street, North Attleboro, collapsed late Monday afternoon, Joseph Bonin of this city was instantly killed when he struck the ground. Ephraim Fontaine, a fellow workman, also of this city, fell sixty feet and was critically injured.

The wires which broke the fall of Bonin to a certain extent were the fire alarm wire and the electric light wire in North Attleboro. This caused the fire alarm to be sounded and for a time a section of the city was in darkness.
