To Oil Westery's Principal Square

Dust Nuisance to Be Stopped If Councilman Langworthy Has to Pay the Freight—Hod Carriers and Laborers' Union Attempts to Corner Contractors—Davis-Taylor Marriage.

The regular monthly meeting of the Westery town council was held Monday, President William L. Clarke presiding, and these councilmen present: Maurice W. Flynn, Albert E. Langworthy, C. Clarence Maxon, Horace Burdick and William Cutler. Town Clerk Everett E. Whipple read the minutes of the prior meeting, which were approved. Ellery S. Barber, overseer of the poor, submitted bills of \$244.71. There is a cash balance of \$319.31 of the appropriation, and the bills were ordered paid.

A unanimously signed petition was received asking that the section of John street that connects with Elm street be made "tradable" and properly lighted, as it was in reality a public necessity. The petition was referred to the highway committee, they to make recommendation to the annual financial town meeting, as there are no funds available for that purpose at the present time.

Hotel license was granted John H. Segar for the Dixon house, with William Segar as surety; Thomas F. Marston for the Martin house, with Mary Graft surety. Victualing licenses were granted to William Spinoe, Main street, Thomas J. Welch, surdy; John W. Berry, Main street, Frank W. Coy, surdy; William A. Rook, Railroad avenue, Thomas J. Hanson, surdy. Albert H. Langworthy, William J. Nichols and John F. Crandall were appointed appraisers for damage by dogs.

William Segar asked the council if something did not be done to abate the dust nuisance in Dixon square and vicinity. He had read that there were no funds available and would not be until after the financial town meeting in June, but he hoped that some way would be found to meet this drawback in this emergency. He suggested that a carload of oil be purchased on credit so that he would furnish the cash for immediate purchase, pending the annual financial town meeting action.
