Members Passed Over in State Encampment Election—Plans for Anti-Saloon League Field Day—Carl J. Nordell Wins Paige Scholarship—Mrs. Ellen Murray Found Dead—Mrs. Alura J. Crandall's Death.

Although Endog post of Westery is one of the most progressive in the state, it received no recognition in the elective and appointive officers at the forty-third annual encampment of the Rhode Island Grand Army of the Republic, which closed in Providence Tuesday afternoon. The appointment of George E. Carpenter of Ashaway as patriotic instructor was the only recognition given Washington county. The officers elected are: Rev. C. H. Ewer of Howard, department commander; Ezra Dixon of Bristol, senior vice department commander; Thomas M. Holden of Riverpoint, junior vice department commander; Rev. Edwin S. Gould of Providence, chaplain; Dr. Charles H. Leonard of Providence, medical director.

Commander Ewer announced these appointments: Philip S. Chase of Providence, assistant adjutant general; Alonzo E. Pierce of Westery, assistant quartermaster general; George H. Cheek of Central Falls, inspector; Ezra K. Parker of Coventry, judge advocate; Stephen H. Brown of Woonsocket, chief mustering officer; George B. Carpenter of Ashaway, patriotic instructor. Commander in Chief Samuel R. Van Zant of Minnesota made brief addresses at the two sessions on Tuesday. At the twenty-third annual convention of the Women's Relief Corps of Rhode Island these officers were elected: Mrs. Annie L. Pender of Providence, president; Mrs. Mary L. Dexter of Pawtucket, senior vice president; Mrs. Harriet A. Hill of Elmhurst, junior vice president; Mrs. Emma Brown of Central Falls, department treasurer; Mrs. Anna Salley of Woonsocket, chaplain.

Pupils of Westery schools are among those who received awards in the monthly contests of the School Arts Guild. William Cunningham of Avondale school was a third prize winner, fourth prize was awarded to Carol Blodgett of Park Avenue school, Mildred Lane of Avondale school, John Montt of Elm Street school and Neil Babber of Pleasant Street school. Revere Clapp, Velt Taibot and Marie Montt received honorable mention.

The trustees of the Rhode Island Anti-Saloon League have arranged for a field day in Westery. Heretofore the plan has been for the state superintendent to visit churches where he could arrange to speak in behalf of the league. Now the trustees are to take more active part in the work and arrangement has been made for the field day in Westery on Sunday, April 17, when representatives of the league will be welcomed to the pulpits and collections will be taken for the benefit of the cause. The following pulpit assignments have been made for the day: Rev. Samuel H. Davis of Westery, to the Seventh-day Baptist church; Rev. Clayton A. Burdick of Westery, to the Elm Street church; Rev. Nathan Edger of Pawtucket, to the First Baptist church; Rev. E. I. Lindh of Providence, to the Congregational church, and Rev. F. H. Spear of Central Falls, to Grace Methodist church.

Dana, formerly pastor of the Methodist church in Woodbury, who eloped with Mrs. George Proctor, wife of one of his parishioners, a year ago, was considered by the delegates in attendance at the New York East conference and after their deliberation Mr. Dana was given a clean bill of character. He was reinstated and licensed to continue preaching.

HO WIRE STARTED. Mrs. Horwitz Lost Her Purse, Lit a Match—Lost \$1,000. Mrs. Jacob Horwitz of 28 Elliott street was looking for her pocketbook Saturday morning with a lighted match, and after some time she found a quantity of clothes was hanging.
