Republican Caucus a Westery

Candidate for Judge of Probate Nominated—Italian Tax-Payers Make Their Influence Felt—\$10,000 Fire at Locustville—Fishing Storehouse Burned by Lightning—Damage Suits in Watch Hill Case—Polisher Injured

Incidental to the alleged passing of the earth through the tail of Haley's comet, there was consternation in the quiet village of Locustville, which is located in Hopkinton township in Washington county adjacent to Hope Valley and is the northern terminus of the Wood River railroad, with an estimated population of three hundred. The excitement was caused by the burning of the Locustville mill, which was aggravated by the fear occasioned by the diamond visitation of the celestial wanderer.

It was the third time that the mill, the chief industry of the village, was visited by fire. The first dam and mill in Locustville were built in 1840 on the banks of Brushy brook, the mill being very small at first and was enlarged in 1820. Woolen goods were manufactured in this mill, but in the ones that followed goods were the product. In 1844 this mill was burned and was replaced by a much larger mill building, which was also destroyed by fire in 1865.

The following year William R. Greene & Co. erected the present large brick building and the mill was operated by the firm for several years. This firm failed and the property was taken over by Bailey & Kenyon, the present owners, about eight years ago. The fire early Thursday morning originated in the picker room, which is located on the second floor of the three-story building, the lower floor being utilized by the weavers and the top floor by the spinners. The fire started in one of the pickers and spread rapidly, but by prompt and vigorous work of the employees and others was subdued, before material damage was done in the spinning and weaving departments. All the stock in the picker room was burned and the machines damaged, causing an estimated loss of \$10,000.

The fire broke out a second time, but did not add materially to the damage and was kept confined to the picker room. The fire will necessitate the closing of the plant for several weeks and as it is the only industry in the village it will cause hardship to the employees, as they will be forced to idleness until the insurance is adjusted and the mill placed in running order.

During the heavenly electrical display just before midnight Wednesday, the fishing storehouse of Truman D. Daniel C. and John O. Babcock, of Avondale, located near the bank of the Pawcatuck river, was struck by lightning, and the building and its contents burned. The building contained several tons of seines and fishing rigging, and general seine fishing utensils which were totally destroyed. The storehouse is located between the limits of the Watch Hill and Westery fire districts and is therefore without fire protection. A bucket brigade was formed, water being taken from the Pawcatuck river, and in this way the residence of Frederick M. Burdick, the nearest building to the fishing storehouse, was saved from the flames. The Babcocks sustain considerable loss, although the burned property was partially insured.

Deputy Sheriff George H. Barber went to Watch Hill Thursday afternoon and made service upon Horace E. Burdick, treasurer of the Watch Hill fire district, in suits for damages brought by Orville G. Barber and Wenton Hoxie, for the demolition of buildings owned by them. The buildings were located on leased land on the waterside of Bay street at Watch Hill, which had recently been purchased by the Watch Hill fire district. The sheriff, upon being notified by Burdick was not surprised that official would result from the removal of the Hoxie and Barber buildings.

Mr. Hoxie lays his damage at \$500 and his case can be tried in the district court. Mr. Barber's claim is for \$1,100 and must be answered in the superior court. The building in question were removed last Sunday by Contractor Charles P. Ecclesstone of Ashaway, by order of the Westery fire district and in spite of the protest of Messrs. Barber and Hoxie. The buildings were removed to permit the general improvement of that section of Watch Hill under the direction of the fire district.

Frank Brucker, a polisher in the employ of the Smith Granite company, received serious injury while at work.
