Have the rice croquettes which have been prepared in the usual way—nicely arranged on a large platter; put the yolks around these in a circle, with the round side up. Eight of the white pieces should be laid in a ring in which red beets have been pickled until they are pretty pink, then they may be arranged in an outer circle around the platter, alternating the pink and white pieces. This is a very pretty dish and should be served with fried or boiled ham. It is also very nice served with fish.
