Funeral of Westery's Postmaster

Worthy Life of Walter Price Eulogized—Commemoration Week Events at High School—Corinthians and Home Team to Play off Rubber—Tefft-Bagley Wedding.

At the family residence in Main street Thursday afternoon many of the friends attended the funeral services of Walter Price, postmaster and a leading citizen of Westery. In the assemblage there was marked representation of his comrades of the Grand Army of the Republic and the entire office force and letter carriers of the Westery postoffice, the office being closed during the services by special contract of the postoffice department. The many floral tributes included large and beautiful pieces from Hancock post, G. A. R., and from the postoffice branches.

Rev. Clayton A. Burdick, pastor of the Seventh-day Baptist church, offered prayer, read from the scriptures and made by reference to the useful life of Walter Price, emphasizing the duty of righteous living in preparation for the coming of the minister of death.

Rev. Samuel H. Davis, a former pastor, eulogized the patriotism and public service of Walter Price, stating that next to family Mr. Price cherished the bronze Grand Army button and what it symbolized. Mr. Davis said that instead of being eulogistic it were better to draw lessons worthy of emulation from the life of the deceased, and the speaker dwelt at some length on that point that was decidedly impressive. The services at the house were closed by prayer offered by Rev. Mr. Davis.

Burial was in the family plot at River Bend, where the committal prayer was by Rev. Mr. Burdick. The bearers were Albert H. Langworthy, Albert N. Crandall, Thomas D. Sheffield and Ira E. Crandall.

The commencement exercises of the Westery High school will be held in Bliven opera house next Wednesday afternoon. There are thirty-three graduates in the class of 1910. In the evening there will be a class reception in the school building. Thursday night the class banquet will be held at the Ocean house, Watch Hill. The majority of the class will go to New Haven the following Saturday to encourage the school team in retaining the championship of the interscholastic baseball league.

The teams are evenly matched and there is probability that the contest will be close and interesting.
