Women as Associate Judges. Maybe they are coming. The mayor of Denver (U. S. A.) has just made this announcement: "I believe that justice can be better administered by two sessions of police court each day, the first where all old offenders are to be tried; and the second session, where first offenders and women shall be tried, and that a woman associate judge be appointed to sit with the police magistrate at the second session of the court. Her recommendations would only be advisory under the present law, but they would have much influence in all decisions. The presence of a woman as an officer of the court would soften the proceedings, temper justice with mercy, and inspire courage as only a woman can. She could do a good work by investigating, outside the court, the causes and conditions leading to a woman's arrest, and help untangle domestic or moral wrongs. I recommend that we try the experiment, and believe good results will follow."—Sydney (N. S. W.) Stock Journal.
