Practically the record of congress for the session is now complete, and, considering the regular progressive warfare, so bitter at times, the record is surprisingly strong and satisfactory. Examine it fairly in the light of the republican platform, and there is but little, if any, ground for serious fault-finding.

The promise of constructive and progressive legislation has been fulfilled with regard to railroads and other public utility corporations, to postal savings banks, to employers' liability, to the land withdrawals in the interest of sound conservation policies, to the creation of a tariff board, to protection of miners, to more effective suppression of the white slave traffic.
