BACK FROM THE RIFLE SHOOT

Major Hagberg Was Ninth on the State Team at Camp Perry, O.—Delegation Returned Saturday with Their Scores.

The members of the Connecticut team, who shot in the national rifle championship at Camp Perry, O., arrived home Saturday with all sorts of praise for the tournament. They brought back with them the individual scores in the matches, which have been awaited with interest by the members of the militia here.

Of the team of twelve, six were Second regiment men and the rest from the other state organizations, and the score shows that the net of the first six men only varies nine points, each one shooting over 248. In the championship the distances were 200, 400 and 1,000 yards, at rapid and slow fire, finishing with a sprinting run.

Many of the men on the team went to the meet early and took part in the individual matches for the prizes this year were distributed on a cash basis, enabling the men to get a little change for expenses.

The conditions during the team match were excellent, but those who took part in the individual matches had plenty of trouble, for on the last day the wind blew at a twenty-knot clip and part of the contestants were stuck in a heavy rainstorm.

The Connecticut team qualified for the second place in the national competition. They left Camp Perry on Thursday and stopped for a day to see the falls at Niagara, where their way was home.

OBITUARY.

Albert G. Allen.

It will be with sincere regret that the many friends of Albert G. Allen, who has been a citizen of this city for over twenty years, learn of his death, which occurred at his home in Phillips avenue, Laurel Hill, Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock. For the past two years he has not been in good health, although he had been doing his work, and had worked last Thursday, on which night he suffered a stroke of apoplexy which caused his death.

Albert G. Allen was born in Rockville, Conn., the eldest of Mr. and Mrs. John Allen. When he was two years of age he moved to Waterbury, where he remained until he was 21, and during which time he learned the cigarmaker's trade. From Waterbury he went west to St. Paul, where he remained a few years, but returned to Waterbury, where he was in business, conducting a cigar and tobacco store for a time. It was about 22 years ago that he came to Norwich and entered the employ of John McNamara as a cigarmaker, but for the past twelve or thirteen years he has been employed by Herbert Pepler at the same place.

Mr. Allen had a large number of friends in this city. He was a man who took an interest in all current events, possessed an amiable disposition and was a kind neighbor and friend to all who knew him.

Besides his wife Mr. Allen is survived by a brother, Robert D. Allen, of North Attleboro, a half brother, Fred Allen, and a half sister, Miss Lillian Hitchcock, all of whom he was very fond of.

He was a member of Uncas lodge, No. 11, I. O. O. F., Norwich Chapter, No. 1, E. C. O. U., and of the Cigarmakers' union and Court Fruitful Vine, E. of A., of Waterbury.
