Catsup Time. In making catsup, chili sauce, relishes or chow-chow, select perfect fruits or vegetables, cook in porcelain or agate ware, never in metal, unless brass, which causes the brass kettle must be scoured bright and clean.

For catsup, instead of boiling, cook out in the tomatoes, and sprinkle with salt—a half teaspoon of salt to six quarts of the vegetable, and let stand over night, then drain and take a scant half hour. Seasoning with perfect tomatoes are used and the work done well, they may then be sealed in small bottles. To prevent the thick, leathery mould which sometimes forms on the top, do not fill the bottles more than half full, but fill being vinegar before sealing. If the bottom forms, every particle of it must be removed, or if there are white specks of mould all through, the catsup is spoiled. After cooking, dip the bottles neck into melted paraffin or melted sealing wax.

Baked Fish. The solid, firm-fleshed fish, comparatively free from bones like halibut and fresh cod, may be cooked to advantage in a baking pan. Sometimes a slice is cut in four places, each raised into a hump and fastened with toothpicks. Dip in melted butter or cover with thin strips of salt pork and make a scant half hour. Seasoning with a little rich milk or thin cream helps and a dusting with salt and white pepper and a success of lettuce should be added before taking up. Potatoes fried in small balls or shredded are often arranged on the side plate.
