Morse's Prison Philosophy.
C. W. Morse's experience in preparing a typewritten catalogue of the Atlanta prison library has impressed him with the limitations of his knowledge.

He is reported as saying, "I never knew before how little I knew, how little I could do any one thing well. In the confession of ignorance lies the beginning of wisdom. But the convicted banker is unduly self-deprecating. No one understands better than he does the special branches of knowledge for which he has a reputation. He is merely out of his mental environment. So a college professor who knew all about Sanscrit or political economy and could not do anything else was in a similar position."

On the other hand, the special training of which the banker confides his lack would probably have kept the world in ignorance of his ability to finance it. In the general grasp of principles more than by a knowledge of minor details that business success is won. Yet Mr. Morse's philosophy is interesting as revealing his discovery that there are other fields of human interest besides company-promoting or the manipulation of all the art of life is comprised in money making, and there are men on small salaries who are better than clerks in his employ at the time of his prosperity—who have found a substitute to replacing what he possessed—New York World.

When a Man is Discharged.
The Texas supreme court has rendered a decision which is of much interest to workmen everywhere, although some of the elements of the case are based on state laws not applicable in other states. The decision in brief is that a corporation cannot give an excuse for the discharge of an employe.

It appears that a brakeman employed on Texas rails was discharged because the airbrakes were not working properly. His superior ordered him to go out with a train using the hand brakes. It was shown that the hand brakes were in a defective condition, that the track was defective and dangerous and that the operating engineer of the train by hand brakes would be extra hazardous. The brakeman refused to serve and quit the service of the railroad. Several days later he asked for his service letter, and was notified that he had been discharged for insubordination. This amounted to a blacklisting of the brakeman. He sued and recovered damages to the tune of \$1,000.

The facts are of interest largely as serving notice on corporations that the days of blacklisting are gone. The provision in Texas law requiring an employer to give a true statement of the reason for a discharge does not appear to be unreasonable.—St. Paul Pioneer Press.

Regulating Chauffeurs.
In the Empire state the unripe driver of the "devil wagon" has been put out of business. Beginning with the first day of this month, it has been unlawful for any youngster under 18 years of age to run a motor car. Before that all other regulations requiring a license unless he shall have satisfied the authorities that he knows a good deal about the running of a machine. Last, and not least, all persons found guilty of "jay riding" will be fined \$500 or imprisoned for three months.

There is an automobile law in this commonwealth which reads: "In approaching or passing a car on the street railways which has been stopped to allow passengers to alight or embark, the operator of every motor vehicle shall slow down, and if it be necessary for the safety of the public he shall bring said vehicle to a full stop."

There is also a practical examination of chauffeurs in this state. The applicant for a license must prove his knowledge of the mechanics of a machine, of the track regulations of cities, and of the law of the road.

To many of the states "jay riding" is practically unconfined, or there is a light penalty that is never enforced. There is opportunity for the law to all along this line. An inquiry into the qualifications of applicant would weed out dangerous, incompetent men at the wheel, and a much more efficient New York and from this state in the matter of automobile regulation.

The growth in the number of machines makes regulation all the more necessary. Active advocates of restrictive legislation are needed in all the states.—Haverhill Gazette.

CONNECTICUT CITIES.

Several of Them Show Great Gains in Population During Past Decade.

In the recapitulation of the bulletins issued by the bureau of the census up to and including Sept. 15, giving the population of cities having a population of more than 25,000, are a mass of interesting statistics. The cities are divided into two groups, those having a population of 100,000 and over and those whose residents rise above the 25,000 mark. There are forty-three cities in the first class and thirty-three in the second. The cities in the first class are New Haven with 122,695, and Bridgeport with 122,695, Detroit, Denver, Columbus and Kansas City are the only cities in this list which show a greater rate of increase than the 43 per cent. of which Bridgeport boasts.

There are 137 cities in the 25,000 and over list, an increase of twenty over the list of 1900. The list is not complete and many others will be added before the announcement of the last census is closed. Waterbury is the Connecticut city in this list which holds the record for increase in the number of its inhabitants. Waterbury's population is 73,141, an increase of 28,444, a percentage of 59.5. Hartford, which just misses the 25,000 mark, has a population of 58,215, an increase of 23.9 per cent.
