There was an important question raised in the trial of Joseph S. Grills of Westerly, charged by Giachino Spennato of New London, with embezzling \$500 from him. The case had progressed to a point where the judge rested, when Mr. Aldrich, associated with Judge Sweeney for defendant, moved that Judge Brown of the superior court, where the case was on at Kingston, direct a verdict to return a verdict for defendant.
