Questions for Mr. Mellen. I would appreciate it, therefore, if you would ask President Mellen to answer explicitly these three questions:

1. Which of the above specific and admitted abuses could be remedied by his proposed court of commerce or enlargement of the superior court?

2. By what judicial process could the remedy be accomplished—by award of damages, injunction, or mandamus?

3. Under what conditions would the remedy be effective to remedy these admitted abuses in large measure?

In his next letter to you, Mr. Mellen refers explicitly to my reply and said: "I do not intend to seriously criticize his (Mr. Jones) general statement of evils sought to be remedied by proposed legislation."

Our supreme court has repeatedly decided that under our constitution the general assembly could not give the superior court—or any other court—power to determine the method by which unsafe conditions should be remedied.


