

New York, March 21.—Horse racing in New York is dead for the year at least. The Jockey club issued a statement tonight, saying that because of adverse legislation it has been decided to make no application for dates.

The abandonment of racing in New York has been expected for some time since the passage of the law making directors of racing associations responsible for betting.
