

FOR SELLING WORTHLESS STOCKS

New York Firm of Brokers Raided Yesterday by Post-office Inspectors—Over \$2,000,000 of Irregularities Claimed to Have Been Discovered—Mails Used to Promote the Frauds.

New York, March 27.—In a raid today on the stock brokerage offices in Fifth avenue occupied by Winner & Co. and the Standard Securities Co., post-office inspectors charged that irregularities amounting to more than \$2,000,000 had been brought to light. Transactions in excess of \$10,000,000 throughout the country are credited to the two concerns in the last few years.

THREE MEN SHOT IN GLEESONDALE MILL

Gleesondale, Mass., March 27.—Three men were wounded in the office of the Gleason woolen mill here today when Phineas Feathers, a former superintendent of the factory, is alleged to have shot the present superintendent, Charles E. Roberts. In the struggle which followed the revolver was discharged several times, one of the bullets penetrating the hand of Robert J. Beavis, an employe, while another bullet wounded Feathers in the nose.

Feathers Demanded Settlement. The trouble started when Feathers entered the office of the mill and approaching Alfred D. Gleason, the owner, it is said, demanded a settlement of a claim that he had against the mill management. He is alleged to have threatened to sue Gleason for the amount of \$10,000, which he claimed to be due him for services rendered.

WHISKEY CAUSED HIS IRRESPONSIBILITY

Testimony in Case of Truskett, on Trial for Murder. Independence, Kan., March 27.—To the surprise of the spectators at the trial of A. A. Truskett, accused of murdering J. D. S. Neely, a wealthy oil operator of Lima, Ohio, the defendant abruptly rested his case without putting the defendant on the stand. Truskett is the only living witness to the shooting of Neely.

GOVERNOR FOSS VETOS \$2500 FOR LOWELL

Does Not Favor Celebration of "March Through Baltimore" Anniversary. Boston, March 27.—If any anniversary in connection with the civil war is to be established at the expense of the state, it should celebrate peace, said Governor Foss in a message to the legislature today in vetoing the bill appropriating \$2,500 for a special celebration at Lowell of the first clash between the north and south in the war.

FIRE ALARM SYSTEM FOR HIGH FACTORIES

New York Fire Gives Impetus to Bill in New York Assembly. Albany, N. Y., March 27.—The assembly committee on labor and industry at a special meeting this afternoon reported Assembly Bill 100, which requires every factory or mercantile establishment conducted in a building two or more stories high in which fifty or more persons are employed to be equipped with a fire alarm system. It also provides for a monthly fire drill.

ANOTHER DEFEAT FOR BAR AND BOTTLE REPEAL

Massachusetts House Turns Down Proposition, 127 to 104. Boston, March 27.—A second attempt through indirect means to repeal the so-called "bar and bottle" bill, which prohibits after May first the sale of bottled liquor over a bar, failed in the house today by a vote of 104 to 127 on the question of adopting a bill for an adverse report of the committee. The bill which failed today reclassified liquor licenses and made it possible for bartenders to sell bottled goods in quantities of less than five gallons, not to be drunk on the premises.

There will be a double funeral Wednesday and interment for the army and navy. Mrs. Davis was 78 years old and Mrs. Davis 68. They had been married fifty years. A daughter and three sons survive.
