WHAT IS GOING ON IN WESTERLY

Horace Vose Opposes Tuberculin Test for Imported Cattle—Easter Musical Plans—Post Office Business Shows Big Increase—Obituary Notes.

There was a hearing on the proposed tuberculin test act, providing for a test for all cattle brought into the state of Rhode Island. The hearing was given in the state senate chamber Thursday afternoon and the act was favored by physicians, the state board of agriculture, officials of health organizations and women who appeared in the interests of pure milk.

Among those who appeared in opposition was Horace Vose of Westerly, the turkey king. Mr. Vose declared that all cattle dealers are expert judges of cattle, and would not buy diseased cattle in any event. If this law was passed, however, it would prevent many excellent trades, because it is sometimes necessary to move swiftly and the delays caused by the necessity of tests might mean a loss of many dollars. He objected to tests of working cattle and beef cattle.

The only other Westerly citizen who spoke at the hearing was John J. Dunn, secretary of the state board of agriculture, and he favored the measure.

The Easter service arranged for Narragansett commandery, No. 27, Knights Templar, will be held in Masonic hall at 8 o'clock Sunday afternoon, and admission will be by ticket only. 
