Tucker, who has been rowing the second eight, was put in at stroke for the varsity.

STOCKS ADVANCE WITH RUSH. Standard Oil Decision Proves a Strong Bullish Factor.

New York, May 16.—Wall street's immediate response to the decision of the supreme court in the Standard Oil case was a strong and sustained demand for securities such as had not been witnessed since the dissolution of the Petroleum Facular syndicate last year. The decision was interpreted as a most important bullish factor, and stocks were advanced with a rush. Standard Oil stock advanced from two to four points.

The demand for stocks was more than local. It began last night in the many orders which came from London and was supplemented at the latter place by home and continental purchases. Operations for the European account may safely be put at not less than 75,000 shares, a larger part of which was later sold here. The domestic demand, aside from local buying, came mainly from such centers as Boston, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh and Chicago, and communication reports a considerable amount of absorption by investors.

Standard Oil stock advanced from two to four points. The effect of this view upon operations in the stock market is seen in the fact that many of the largest advances were made in corporations which are at present involved in proceedings instituted by the government or have been in the past, or account of the nature of their activities. Union Pacific, which is involved in the Harriman merger suit, now pending in the courts, made the largest gain of any of the active stocks. General Electric, which is chiefly concerned in the suit recently brought by the government against various electrical companies, was one of the strongest.

IN THE AUTOMOBILE WORLD Five Rules to Avoid Skidding—Right Starting Prolongs Life of Car—Proper Methods of Washing.

With the top up a car which is slightly noisy will always sound noisier than when the top is down. This is because the top when shut tends to carry and accentuate minor rattles and squeaks.

Knowing how to start right is one of the points that will contribute to the wear of a car. A smooth start should be striven for, not engaging the clutch when wishing to stop. Keep as straight a course as possible, i. e., turn the steering wheel as little as possible.

When you meet another vehicle in trouble, help if you can. There's no telling how soon you may be glad to have some one take an interest in your predicament.

Five rules can be recommended to avoid skidding: 1. Drive slowly; 2. Use the hand brake, working equally on both wheels, and not the foot brake when wishing to stop. 3. Keep as straight a course as possible, i. e., turn the steering wheel as little as possible.

4. Keep on the most level part of the road, and do not get near the edge, especially if there is much camber. 5. Disengage the clutch if the car begins to skid.

Motorists find it well worth the trouble to keep an accurate odometer record of the mileage of each of their tires. It is a valuable index of what you ought to expect from each shoe.

Look for three causes when a machine smokes—over-lubrication, over-rich mixture, or oil or grease coming in contact with the hot exhaust pipe or muffler.

One secret of good car washing lies in the proper use of soap. First thoroughly dissolve in hot water. It can then be added to the lukewarm wash-water in proper proportions. Greasy sand pans are to be avoided when sponging off the car, and the hose should not be played directly through the radiator or engine.
