MUCH IN LITTLE. Experts from Holland are introducing the diamond cutting and polishing business in New York. This may make the gem a bit cheaper. American buyers in Ottawa have been told to a total of \$10,000,000 in polished diamonds and only \$500,000 in rough stones.

Consul General John G. Foster reports that a contract for the construction of a canal, which will connect the canal area between the Sappers and Dufferin bridges in front of the post office in Ottawa, has been let to a local firm, the contract price reported as \$25,000.
