MUMPS HIT HARVARD FRESHMEN Coxswain Hay Develops Disease—He is Sent Back to Cambridge—Nicholas Roosevelt to Take His Place—Eights do Easy Paddling.

Red Top, Conn., June 13.—Mumps broke out in the freshmen quads today. Coxswain of the Harvard crew, Nicholas Roosevelt, is sent back to Cambridge this afternoon. Hay, who was in the rowing team, is also sent back to Cambridge. Roosevelt is the old Columbia coach, who is at Red Top for a few days, diagnosed the case as mumps, and to prevent a possible spread Hay was sent away.

Nicholas Roosevelt was sent for and is expected to arrive from Cambridge tonight and take Hay's place in the eight. None of the other members of the crew show signs of contracting the ailment, but all precautions are being taken to prevent its spread.

IN THE AUTOMOBILE WORLD. Automobiles on Oregon Stage Route—28,000 Men to Build Tennessee Highway in One Day—Machinery Hints.

Gasoline, even if stale, comes in handy for removing grease spots from the clothes. The campaign against motorists who persist in using the rubber cutout in city streets, begun by the licensed dealers in New York, is already having effect.

Automobiles have replaced the ancient horse-drawn stages that piled between Scio and Albany, Ore. James Pound, owner of the Scio-Village stage lines, has bought a five-passenger automobile and established an automobile service on Saturdays between Scio and Albany, the Linn county capital.

Sometimes when a gear change from a lower to a higher speed has been made it will be found that the engine begins to thump heavily. The thumping can be instantly stopped by lightly touching the clutch pedal so that a little slip takes place.

The owner of an automobile soon finds that nothing is more detrimental to a car than the improper and excessive use of the brakes. During April there were exported \$292,333 worth of automobile tires and \$57,412 worth of other tires, showing a considerable increase over the amount sent out during the preceding month.

To prevent the cylinder port cocks becoming clogged with carbon and excessive use of the brakes. It is an excellent plan to open them occasionally when the engine is running. In this way the accumulations are blown out.
