WESTERY AND STONINGTON TIED For First Place in R. I.-Conn. League - Pawcatuck and Mystic Tied For Second Place - Modification Allowed in Quoncontaug Cesspool Case - Watch Hill Fire District Meeting to Deal With Important Issues.

The original plan adopted by the Rhode Island general assembly less than ten years ago to have a definite system of trunk lines built and maintained by the state has been gradually converted into a political mud tree for the country legislators and now state road building has become a haphazard affair subject to political influence and the original plan has been swamped by amendments.

It happened that the routes of the seven principal highways as originally sketched did not touch the town of Lincoln. The oversight was not pleasing to the legislators from that town and they really did get an appropriation of \$5,000 for rebuilding a piece of road that leads from Central Falls towards Lime Rock and it became a part of the state road system.

While the debate concerning the resolutions was in progress the member from West Greenwich spoke to the fact that he had put in no bill to add the state roads in his town. Therefore he hurried over to the desk of the gentleman from Westerly, Albert B. Crafts, who was helping to steer the resolutions through the house, and told Mr. Crafts what he wanted.

The numerous additions, together with the solemn and oft-repeated declaration of the board of public roads that its system could not stand the weight of another mill, held the politicians back in the present of the road in Westerly being the only new piece reported and passed. The game was renewed with vigor in 1908, 1909 and 1910, and also in 1911.

The motion of Hattie E. Eldredge to vacate the injunction restraining the use of certain cesspools in the rear of her hotel at Quoncontaug and allowing the same to enter into the breachway was denied by Judge Baker in the superior court. The motion of the respondent that the injunction be so modified that the cesspools can be used, but they must not enter into the breachway, was allowed by the court.
