Track Extension For Trolley Express Connecticut Company Asks Council For Approval of Plan to Extend Line Down Shetucket Street.

The Connecticut company, through Samuel Anderson, superintendent of the local lines, has communicated to the court of common council that it has the right to build an extension from a point in Shetucket street where the line branches off to Laurel hill, west a distance of 550 feet, with the right to put in switches, poles, wires and appurtenances.

It is intended to start this work very soon. A petition received by the executive committee is for the acceptance of Maple Grove court off Asylum street, where a number of building lots have been laid out, but no buildings have yet been erected.

These wagon loads of guns, knives and ammunition were taken in charge by officers. While the town is quiet under militia protection, a gift that is said to be the finest of the sort ever made to an Episcopal church in this state. A New York architect is at work on the gift and will have it ready for delivery soon.

DODGING MANY PIPES. Network Underground Found in Laying Water Main.

The pipe line in West Main street for the new reservoir has now reached a point opposite the westerly side of North Thames street and the ditch is being opened in the Holy Ghost with the city system at Thames square. A gate and a blowoff will be put in at this point. The ditch diggers are finding the ground already full of all kinds of pipes, water, gas, and telephone conduits, considerably hampering their work as they are compelled to change their plans to new pipe at various different points so as to get past the pipes already in the ground.

MILKMEN'S BOTTLES. Derby People Do Not Return Them and Are to Be Charged for Them.

Milkmen of the associated towns are complaining about the bottles they use to receive their milk. A large number of the residents of Shelton and Derby buy milk in the bottle and never return the bottle. On each bottle as it goes out are the words, "Wash and return," but some people do not heed them and either destroy or keep the bottles. There again some people do not even wash out the bottles, but simply return them without the milk, and the danger they place hundreds of other people in. Some of the milkmen receive the bottles filled with suds, and they are compelled to wash them out a great amount of time and holds the milkman back in his daily duties. This can be remedied by every housewife cleaning the bottle before she returns the same to the milk dealer. This also when they receive the bottles they should leave them out the morning for collection by the milkman who will use them again. This a large number of the housekeepers do not do and it causes a great amount of complaint. One dealer returned a gross of bottles nine months ago and can now only lay claim to about four gross. He can not tell where the other six gross have gone. To remedy this, the milkmen of the associated towns have combined, it is said, are going to tax the housekeeper for returning the bottles. This will be a good lesson to those delinquent ones, and will be an example for the rest.—Ansonia Sentinel.
