

Rims should be treated with flake graphite as a preventive of rust. The application of a thin coat of quick drying shellac varnish, to which flake graphite has been added until the consistency is about like that of thick cream, has given good results.

If a tar stain is to be removed at all it must be done while the tar is fresh. It is not even safe to wait till reaching home, but after driving over, freshly sprayed tar the car should be stopped for cleaning at the next village encountered.

Sticks, stones and the various inequalities of the road should be avoided by the driver, as they are liable to damage the tires. Street car tracks should be given wide leeway, as the fine particles of steel will play havoc with the tires if given half a chance.

Putting in a gasket or packing a pipe connection is necessary to see that the packing does not squeeze into the pipe so as to stop the passage. If the joint is opened frequently, coat one side of an asbestos, paper or canvas gasket with graphite, and the other side with oil or varnish.

FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL.

A BEARISH DAY. Quotations Carried Down from One to Three Points.

New York, Dec. 8.—The declining tendency of stocks was again apparent today. The most severe losses of the week were indicated during a sharp attack by the bears. The depression was general and quotations were carried down one to three points. A rally late in the session reduced the declines largely, and many of the favorite issues closed only fractionally off on the day.

The most spirited bear attack came shortly before noon, and was attributed to publication of an interview with President Frank A. Vanderlip of the National City bank, which was regarded as decidedly pessimistic. Attention was drawn to Mr. Vanderlip's remarks because of his association with some of the leading financial interests of the country. After expressing the opinion that the outlook for business was the most serious of years, he gave as the underlying cause "the chaotic situation resulting from the attempt to adjust business to law," which he said had brought about a disturbed state of mind among business men generally.

Mr. Vanderlip's utterances derived the greater emphasis from being made at a time when there is a widespread conviction that the trade depression is being relieved.
