LENTEN SERMON BY REV. P. CAREY

Christ Church Filled as Former Rector Occupied Pulpit— Many Met Him in Sunday School Room After Service.

Brought together by the high regard in which they held their former rector, Rev. Neilson Poe Carey, and the pleasure it gave them to hear him again, Christ Episcopal church had a congregation which practically filled the seats in the body of the church for the united Lenten service on Wednesday evening.

For his impressive discourse, Rev. Mr. Carey took the text, John xix: 37: "They shall look on him whom they have pierced."

have pierced." As a foundation thought he quoted a story from one of Canon Farrar's books, in which the distinguished author instanced a visitor to the art galleries of Florence who spoke in contemptuous terms of the masterpieces he had there seen.

AEROPLANE GUN TESTED OFF FORT WRIGHT

Said to Be Largest One Made and Was Fired Without Recoil.

What is claimed to be the largest aeroplane gun yet made was successfully tested Wednesday afternoon on a barge off Fort Wright, Fishers Island, in the presence of a number of United States naval and army officers.

The inventor of the gun is Commander Cleland Davis, U.S.N., of Washington, who had it built by a New London firm. It is a four-inch gun, twelve feet long, weighs 150 pounds, and fires a projectile weighing 35 pounds at a velocity of more than 1,000 feet per second.

Commander Davis and others expressed themselves as extremely well pleased with today's test. After a few minor changes have been made, the gun will be shipped to Washington, to be officially tested by the government.

we know now that we were not meant to be only of an animal nature but to exalt our spiritual nature designed to be companions of God. It is too late now for our criticism of these pictures. They have transformed the world, and as they have their effect upon us, so they judge our souls. If for us there is any beauty and no appeal, then we are judged.

Lay Aside Prejudice and Self-Concept The first thing for us to do to look at these pictures of the Christ is to lay aside our prejudice and self-concept and stand before them, ready to receive with the heart and mind of a little child. The kingdom of heaven is revealed only to him who comes ready to be taught.

The first picture for us to see is of the helpline and helpful Jesus. He went about doing good. What effect upon your heart and mine has this picture? Can you look at with a good conscience and does it make you hang your head with shame?

The second picture is that of Jesus carrying out the work which he had to do, the example of a life with a steady purpose. The next is a wonderful picture, that of the Son of God among us as one who serves. Here is the parable of his whole life. He did not send another, but came himself, for any service, however humble.

And the last is the most wonderful picture, that of the crucified Christ, with the words of forgiveness upon his lips. Does the sight of the crucified one make you more willing to carry bravely the work that is given you to do, and can you say with Paul, God forbid that I should glory save in the cross of Jesus Christ? The master appealed to his hearers that they should not be indifferent or refuse to look upon these pictures of the Son of God, but that the sight of the crucified one might raise in an ever-present inspiration to high and better living until that day when God shall see fit to call us home.

OPEN MEETING OF INDEPENDENT FORESTERS.

Deputy Supreme Chief Ranger McGrath Addressed Large Gathering.

Court Norwich, No. 4889, Independent Order of Foresters, successfully conducted an open meeting on Wednesday evening in Foresters' hall, at which Deputy Supreme Chief Ranger J. J. McGrath of Providence and small delegations from Court Savies of Baltic and Court New London were visitors.

There was an attendance of close to 50 present, when Chief Ranger McGrath opened the meeting with brief but cordial welcoming words to the members and their friends who were present. Deputy Supreme Chief Ranger McGrath made the principal address of the evening, speaking convincingly of the strength and merits of the order, which he described as the richest fraternal society in the world and the first in financial strength.

It has a membership of more than 241,000 over \$18,000,000 in its surplus fund and \$20 millions insurance in force. The average insurance carried by its members is \$300. He placed emphasis upon its sick benefit features, its provisions for the children of deceased members, the feature of partial payment of the capital sum in case of total disability and the fact that it was giving insurance at cost. He invited the non-members present to take an early opportunity of uniting with Court Norwich.

During the evening Chief Ranger Dennis Sullivan of Court Savies was heard in a recitation. Chief Ranger Miner of New London and Vice-Clerk Ranger Nagle of the same court both spoke briefly, referring to the institution of the court last Sunday with 52 charter members, and the prospect that 50 more would very soon be added. Members of Court Norwich were also heard from in brief remarks, and refreshments of sandwiches, cake and coffee were served. After the formal programme was concluded, the members gathered around the piano for a social sing before they said "Good night."


