NAMES OF 27 OF IDENTIFIED DEAD

List Sent to White Star Line Officers Does Not Include Any Prominent Passengers

A STEAMER WITHIN FIVE MILES OF TITANIC

Fourth Officer Boxhall Testifies That He Signaled to It in Vain—Vice President Franklin Admits That Titanic Did Not Have Enough Lifeboats to Accommodate Crew—Probable Solution of Mystery of the Two Little Boys.

New York, April 22.—The first list of names of bodies recovered from the Titanic disaster by the cable steamer Mackay-Bennett was received here tonight in wireless messages to the White Star line officers. The list of 27 names contains names of several of the most prominent men who perished unless it be "George W. Widen," as sent by wireless, refers as is believed probably to George W. Widen, a resident of Philadelphia. The original passenger list of the Titanic do not mention "Widen," which apparently shows that the White Star line, who, with his son Harry, was lost.

Some May Be Members of Crew. A number of the 27 principal names in the list do not appear on the Titanic passenger list, which leads to the belief that a number of the bodies recovered are those of members of the Titanic's crew. The White Star officials studied without success in interpreting the meaning of some of the spellings, and some of the names were interpreted as being badly garbled because of the fact that the list had been relayed by wireless. In fact, three wireless messages were sent by cable to New York.

Telegram operators acquainted with both the Morse and continental code speculated as to whether the names of Major Archibald Butt, and John Jacob Astor were intended in two instances, but they could come to no decision that appeared trustworthy in such a case.

Possibly Astor and Butt. In the list, as it appears in the following combination appeared: "Nihil Behedig R. B. Ati," which operators believe might have been intended for Major Butt's name.

Similar speculation developed over the name "N. Colas Rasher," a name which the White Star line could not account for, and at which the cable operators thought might be Colonel Astor.

The White Star line dispatched a message in an effort to clear up such questionable interpretations and for this and the possible receipt of further names, officials of the company kept their offices open all night.

BURIED AT SEA.

All Bodies Unidentified Consigned With Appropriate Services. Halifax, N. S., April 22.—Late reports received here indicate that when darkness fell tonight the cable steamer Mackay-Bennett, which went to the scene of the Titanic disaster for the purpose, had recovered 33 bodies. How many of these have been identified is not clear, but that some bodies were made certain today when the Mackay-Bennett sent a wireless dispatch that 33 bodies were not embalmed.

THE TWO LITTLE BOYS

Probably Sons of Woman in Nice Whose Husband Took Them Away. Nice, France, April 22.—It is possible that the mystery of the identity of the two children answering to the names of "Two Little Boys" who were saved from the Titanic, may soon be cleared up. Mrs. Navratil, the wife of a tailor, living here, declares that she recognizes her two children in the description of the little boys. She is separated from her husband, who a month ago, she says, took away the children and disappeared, after telling her that he was going to America.

Halt in Strike of Engineers

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT OFFERS FRIENDLY OFFICES. SITUATION IS CRITICAL 72 KILLED OUTRIGHT

Decision Had Been Reached to Strike Within 36 Hours—The Central Vermont Refused Not Affected.

New York, April 22.—Tender of the "friendly offices" of representatives of the Federal government called at the least a temporary halt tonight to a strike by railroad engineers in all the territory east of Chicago and north of the Potomac river, in which it is estimated that 52 per cent of the railroad traffic of the entire country is conducted.

The offer of mediation followed immediately the refusal by the managers of 44 railroads to consent to the engineers' demands for an increase in wages of 15 per cent, and the announcement today arranged to afford state relief to the stricken districts in Illinois.
