

WESTERLY TO SWAT FLIES

Anti-Tuberculosis Society Promises Ten Cents a Hundred For Dead Pests—John H. Scranton Elected Secretary of Agricultural Society—Wireless Station at Pleasant View—George A. Clarke Injured.

The Westery branch of the Rhode Island Anti-Tuberculosis association is to conduct a campaign against house flies between May 8 and May 20. Ten cents a hundred will be paid for overwintering flies to any person under 21 years of age resident in Pawcatuck or Westery.

The state rifle range at Rumford is to be considerably changed before the range season opens next month. The state having appropriated \$5,000 for the purpose, a new range house will be erected about 200 yards in front of the present 300 yard firing line.


