

FOUR SENTENCED IN SUPERIOR COURT

Frank Miner of Groton Gets State's Prison Sentence For Statutory Rape—George Frazier and Raymond Sistaire and Mollie Edwards Hear Judgment Pronounced.

The May criminal term of the superior court opened in New London Tuesday. Court was scheduled to open at 10.30, but the train which brought Judge Joel H. Reed from his home at Stafford Springs was nearly two hours late, and the judge did not arrive until 12.15, and court did not open until 12.45.

The day was given over to arranging the cases, putting the prisoners to plea. No cases were tried. Court was opened with prayer by Rev. Charles R. McNally, pastor of the First Baptist church. Sheriff Sidney A. Brown then formally opened the term.

In the case of the state vs. A. S. Potter, charged with manslaughter in causing the death of Mrs. Christopher Newbury by running into her on the highway in Waterford about three months ago, while driving the touring car owned by Mr. and Mrs. George M. Landers of New London, a continuance to the September term was granted by Judge Reed.

Roscoe C. Allen of Norwich pleaded guilty to statutory burglary, entering a building in this city on April 13 of this year and stealing six bottles of wine, some cigars, a white vest, a violin and a violin box. Allen was charged with burglary on two other occasions, but these two counts were suspended on recommendation of State Attorney Hull, and Allen then pleaded guilty to the first count.

Ernest and Robert Frost, brothers, negroes, pleaded not guilty to the charge of theft from the person. They are charged with stealing \$2.94 from the person of Elijah P. Williams in Norwich on March 1.

No Plea in Houston Cases. John and Mary Ann Houston of Norwich, charged with receiving stolen goods, were not put to plea as their counsel, Attorney Desmond of Norwich, was unable to be present.

George Frazier, alias John Doe, charged with carrying concealed weapons in North Stonington, pleaded not guilty. Frazier is charged with carrying a pistol and three razors. Attorney Barnes was appointed to defend him.

William Pero of Norwich, aged 27, was presented charged with statutory arson in setting fire to a barn in Norwich on March 27.

Helen Schellen, about 25, was presented charged with theft in stealing two diamond pins, valued at \$500, a watch valued at \$5 and \$20 in money from August Braum of Stonington on Oct. 15, 1911. She pleaded not guilty. She is out under bonds.

Norwich Bigamy Case. Edward F. Stacey of Norwich pleaded not guilty to the charge of bigamy. He is charged with having married Olive Sherman at Wilmington, Del. in 1904, and with his first wife still living married Sarah Palmer at Norwich, March 8 of this year and having lived with her as her husband.

Sentences Pronounced. In the afternoon session Frank Miner, Groton, charged with statutory rape, was given a sentence of two to four years in state prison.

Mollie Edwards, Groton, charged with abetting rape, was given a year in jail.

George Frazier, North Stonington, charged with carrying concealed weapons, was given two months in jail.

Raymond Sistaire, charged with burglary at a Noank store, was given sentence of one year in jail, but sentence was suspended and he was placed in charge of the probation officer.
