STATE HOSPITAL BIDS. Wiring and Plumbing for New Buildings Awarded.

The building committee of the Norwich State hospital met at 10:30 o'clock Monday forenoon to open bids for the wiring of the dining room, club house and cow barn, plumbing of the dining room building, club house and Ward E north and south, and for the electric elevator in the dining room building.

The wiring contract was awarded W. W. Galt & Co. of New Haven. Other bidders were T. M. Russell, company of Middletown, Connecticut Electric Equipment company of Meriden, Whitehall Electric company of Westery, Eaton Chase company and Preston Bros. of Norwich.
