CONSERVING RESOURCES.

By the decision to secure a large tract of virgin forest in New Hampshire, the Appalachian commission has made its first step towards the establishment of a national park and the conservation of the natural resources of New England, a most important action when its value is fully considered.

The commission had but little time in which to act to get the benefit of its appropriation for the year, having delayed for the report of the United States geological survey on the relation of the forests to the supply of water for navigable streams.

How Turkey will act in regard to the expressed willingness of Italy to agree to terms of peace is a problem, in the face of her present attitude in the matter.

Following Italy's success in northern Africa she began to pick up the islands in the Aegean, supposedly to bring Turkey to a realization of her helplessness, but it has failed to work, so far, at least.

BULLETIN'S SPECIAL YALE LETTER

Twelve Degrees Conferred at Commencement Exercises—Bob Cook Stroke Encourages Blue Supporters to Hope For Victory on the Thames—Graduates' Night on the Campus—Proposal to Rebuild Old Brick Row—Honors Come This Way.

New Haven, June 20.—Eleven noted men, and one equally well known woman, were honored with Yale degrees at the 212th annual commencement exercises in Woolsey hall, yesterday morning, while to 300 students in her graduates and undergraduate departments were given the rewards of their years of study.

The proposal of rebuilding the old Brick row has been made in a letter by a New Haven graduate to the Alumni Weekly. He feels that Yale undergraduate life should be centered on the campus, and that the erection of more recitation halls and dormitories outside would destroy the unity that is so desirable.

Following the presentation of degrees over 800 Yale graduates attended the closing exercises at the commencement, the alumni dinner in the university dining hall. The speakers at the dinner included President Hadley, who presided; Colonel Goethals, Secretary MacVeagh, Dr. Hume of the Yale mission at Changsha, and ex-President Dwight.
