LUMBER JACK DRUGGED AND ROBBED OF \$140 Edward Crozier Found on Water Street in New London.

Drugged and robbed of about \$140, Edward Crozier, 47 years old, a lumberjack, was found in Water street in New London Monday afternoon close to the spot on the Chelsea wharf where Charles H. Witter was murdered for his money, 10 years ago.

Crozier was found by Michael O'Donnell, a railroad man. He was lying in a secluded part of the wharf and could hardly be seen by passersby. It has been proved conclusively that Crozier was robbed in broad daylight as he was seen about the streets after 9 o'clock.

On Saturday evening, Crozier placed \$140 in 14 ten-dollar bills in the hands of a friend as he was afraid of losing the money in such an intoxicated condition. He called on this friend Monday morning at 3 o'clock and wanted the money. Crozier was warned that he would be likely to lose it but he insisted and the banker took back a written receipt, showing he had turned it over to Crozier again.

One young man, suspected by the police of being concerned in the robbery, was with Crozier at the time. The police have found also that two other young men, who have police court records, later joined Crozier and the other man. The quartet was later seen in Water street. Two of the men were seen subsequently without Crozier.

O'Donnell, finding Crozier and suspecting foul play, called the police patrolman Sullivan and Hammett, who were working up the case and were confident of making arrests soon.

WAS NAVIGATOR OF THE STEAMER ELLA. Captain Edward Smith, 80, Died at His Son's Home in West Haven.

Captain Edward Smith, one of the oldest licensed navigators in the United States died Monday at the home of his son, Edward Smith, in West Haven. Captain Smith was 80 years old. His wife survives him.

Captain Smith was a son of Captain Edward Smith, an old whaling master, and Maria Geer Smith. He was a lineal descendant of Robert Allen of Allynn Point. Captain Smith's last command was steamer Munnatawket, of which he took charge for the summer of 1912 on June 1st. He returned and went to live in West Haven in the fall.
