With two or three other little girls on Tuesday she discovered in the rear of a store on Main street a quantity of pickles that were old and stale and had been thrown away. Irene ate four but the others left them alone. A couple of hours later she was taken ill and physicians summoned. After he had worked over her she seemed to be recovered but next morning an ill turn developed and she died.
