

JUNE NIGHTS COLD FOR C. N. C. MEN

Connecticut Soldiers Shiver in Their Tents at Fishers Island— Col. Dorsey Finds Employers Reluctant to Let Their Men Off For Camp Duty—Captain Tarbox Was Officer of the Day Wednesday.

The six companies of Connecticut Coast artillery in camp at Fort H. G. Wright shivered in the cold Tuesday and Wednesday nights under canvas. The wind that swept over Block Island sound penetrated tents and did not warm up before it struck through the heavy army blankets.

Col. Henry S. Dorsey of New London, commanding the camp, said Wednesday that the reluctance with which employers allowed their men to go to a camp was threatening the success of the tour of duty.
