The sleeve is styled with drop shoulder, dressy in wrist or elbow length. For dressy occasions this model would be nice in crepe or chiffon tulle, or in henriettes, combined with brocaded silk for the vest, satin or messaline for the girthing, cuffs and collar, finish, and net or lace for the chemise. For general wear, serge, voile, lawn or gingham or tab silks would serve nicely, with contrasting material or embroidery for trimming. The Baptist Union of England is seeking to raise a subscription fund of \$125,000 to guarantee a minimum fund wage to every Baptist minister. Probably the highest death rate of any city in the world belongs to Cochabamba, Bolivia, where there was a mortality of 75 in each 1,000 last year. The English postoffice has 2,610,453 miles of single wire, made up of 833,865 for telegraphs, 2,284,215 for telephones and 62,038 for private and leased wires. A German pound is exactly one-half of the metric kilo and equals 1.103 English (avoirdupois) pounds. An English pound equals 0.9072 German pound, or 4.3336 kilo. The workshops of the South Manchuria railway at Shaboken, a few miles from Darien, representing with their equipment, an outlay of \$2,946,000, are fitted throughout with modern appliances. While the total immigration to Canada increased from 355,804 in 1912 to 415,570 in 1913, or 6 per cent, the number of immigrants from the United States decreased from 140,143 in 1912 to 116,751 in 1913, or more than 17 per cent.
