Library Secures Picture of America, Winner of Queen's Cup — Complaint Against Salomeno For Carrying a Concealed Weapon—Norwich Telephone Man An Expert Splicer.

The Westery Memorial and Library association has secured an old-time colored print of the famous schooner yacht America, winner of the Queen's cup in the great match for all nations at Dover, August 22, 1851, and the cup has never been "lifted" from the New York Yacht club although there have been many attempts to win the trophy back for old England many times in the sixty-three years. Just at this time when yachtsmen are busy in the construction of cup defenders to meet the challenge of Sir Thomas Lipton, this picture is of more than common interest and attracts attention in the reading room. Nowadays the craft contesting for the trophy and the honor are racing machines, while the America was a pleasure yacht as well as a racer and for many years participated in the annual yacht cruise, with owner and friends and a full complement crew aboard, just the same as every yacht in the fleet.
