DOINGS IN THE AUTO WORLD

One Third of State Highways in Ohio are of Brick and Concrete Construction—Sioux City 300 Mile Sweepstakes Race to be a Good One—First Automobile Built in 1784.

Slightly more than one-third of the 573 miles of state highways built and contracted for in Ohio during the last seven years has been of brick and concrete construction.

The first concrete road contracted for in Ohio was put down in July 1, 1911, although the city of Bellefontaine, Ohio, laid the first concrete pavement in the country twenty-two years ago.

The average cost per foot in width one mile long of different kinds of roads built in Ohio last year was as follows: Brick, \$1,379.
