TIGERS CAPTURED BASEBALL SERIES

Defted Yale in Deciding Game on Polo Grounds, New York, by Score of 1 to 0—Great Pitchers' Battle Between Deyo and Way—Both Teams Fielded in Sensational Style.

New York, June 23—Princeton defeated Yale in the deciding game of the series on the Polo Grounds here today in a well played game by a score of 1 to 0. Deyo and Way had a sensational pitchers' battle and the little Princeton star won by a shade. He permitted only three hits all of them going to Hanes, who had a perfect batting average. Princeton scored the only run of the game in the fourth inning.

Hanes led off with a single and was the first Princetonian to reach first base. He was sacrificed to second by Laird and went to third on Gill's infield out scoring himself.

Swhart hurt his leg sliding to first base and was relieved by Pumphrey in the fourth inning.

Deyo pitched himself out of a bad hole in the third when Yale filled the bases with none out. Middlebrook was safe on Rhoads' fumble and went to third when Deyo fumbled Hanes' sacrifice bunt.

A pass to Blossom filled the bases. Deyo then struck out Cornish and Rolly sent a short fly to Green, whose perfect throw easily doubled Middlebrook at the plate.

Both teams fielded in sensational style. Gill made two pretty one handed picks in the third for Princeton and outfielders Falsely, Green and Baird made good catches. The score:

At the conclusion is drawn that the new circuit will not provide franchises for the Cardinals, St. Louis, St. Paul and any other Federal league promoters.


