The Bulletin \$50,000 FIRE AND LIFE Insurance Bank Mill of the C. M. Robertson Paper Company's Plant Almost Totally Destroyed Early Monday Evening After Explosion of Oil Lamp—High Wind Fanned Flames—Partial Insurance.

The Bank mill, one of the three mills operated by the C. M. Robertson Paper Company and located about two and a half miles from the Montville post office, was almost totally destroyed by the early Monday evening. Just after 8 o'clock Monday evening, the lamp exploded in the north end of the machine shop and a few minutes later the same lamp exploded in the mill building. In less than ten minutes the building was a mass of flames which shot up into the air and an hour after the fire had started the mill was in ruins.

The Bank mill, one of the three mills operated by the C. M. General Manager Burdard said that the mill was of stone construction and employed about 16 hands who were built for the C. M. Robertson Paper Company in 1886 by Contractor George Frost of New London and was constructed of stone quarried from a nearby ledge. The plant was valued at \$100,000 and was insured by the Commercial Union Assurance Co. of New York.

At 7:15 o'clock Chief Howard L. Stanton of the Norwich fire department received a telephone call asking for help, but owing to the high wind that prevailed throughout the evening, and the fact that the fire was in a remote location, it was not until 8 o'clock that the fire department was alerted.
