REGULARS WIN IN BIG CAUCUS

Independent Democrats Decisively Defeated in Election of State Convention Delegates—Regulars Swept the Field in Every Contest—871 Votes Cast When M. W. Keough Defeated Edward F. Comerford—Mayor T. C. Murphy and William H. Callahan Head the Ticket Without Opposition.

In a democratic caucus that was a record breaker for size in the town hall on Monday evening and brought forth contests on six of the eight names to be chosen for the town committee and the state central committee, Dr. W. C. McLaughlin and Compensation Commissioner Dr. J. J. Donohue administered a decisive defeat to the ticket put forth by the independents.

From the Greenville District. Thomas M. Shields nominated Dr. William C. McLaughlin from the third district, saying that it was an important district and one of the strongest democratic ones and deserved to be well represented.
