ENGLAND APPREHENSIVE ABOUT GERMAN AEROPLANES

For Weeks Lights About Buckingham Palace Have Not Been Burning. Correspondence of the Associated Press. London, Sept. 23.—With the first rainy days of autumn and threatened fogs England is becoming more and more apprehensive about German aeroplanes and Zeppelins.

RUSSIA SHOWS FRIENDSHIP FOR THE UNITED STATES.

May Lead to Negotiations for a New Treaty of Commerce. Washington, Sept. 23.—Russia's manifestation of friendship for the United States, expressed in her announced intention of signing a peace commission treaty may lead to negotiations for a new treaty of commerce and navigation between the two countries to replace the one abrogated during the Taft administration.

1133 MEN WERE LOST WITH BRITISH CRUISERS.

It is Possible Some Rescues May Yet Be Heard From. Lowestoft, Sept. 23, by way of London, 7:25 p. m.—So far as can be ascertained, 1,077 officers and men were saved out of a total of 2,200 who were on board the three British cruisers when they were sunk by a German submarine yesterday.

British Captain Went Down With Ship

London, Sept. 23, 8:03 p. m.—The correspondent at Harwick of the Evening News says he learns from survivors of the disaster to the British cruisers Aboukir, Cressy and Hogue, that Captain Robert W. Johnson, of the Cressy went down with his ship, cheered by his men who were swimming around the doomed vessel.

Difficult to Locate Airship at Night

It is generally conceded that Zeppelins could hardly make a trip over as well defended a city as London in the day time because of the danger from guns fired from high buildings. Still the firing of such guns is highly dangerous in a crowded city like London because the shells discharged at the aircraft must inevitably do great damage when they hit the earth.

Asked to Reduce Lights.

For weeks the lights about the Buckingham Palace have not been lighted and within the last few days only about one third of the London Street lights have been turned on. Lights are few and far between on the docks and bridges across the Thames. Stores, theatres, hotels and other public places have been asked through newspapers to reduce their lights to the minimum, that London may not offer a bright glow for the guidance of aerial navigators.

British Airships on Guard.

At St. Paul's Cathedral and other centrally located buildings surrounded by a circle of lights the lighting has been so far reduced that these great buildings cannot be distinguished by the illumination. British airships fly over London day and night and through their observations have been able to direct the suppression of light to the best advantage.
