# GERMANS STILL TRYING TO BREAK THROUGH TO CALAIS

## No Marked Changes in the Battle Line in France and Belgium

### GERMANS CLAIM PROGRESS NEAR THE YPRES

Russia contends that her troops are defeating the Turks, but denial is made by the Ottoman government—A Petrograd newspaper says a Turkish army of 90,000 men has occupied many villages on the Caucasus frontier—France has formally declared war on Turkey—British mine sweeper Mary has been sunk in the North Sea—Report that marines from American cruiser North Carolina have been landed at Beirut, Syria, is questioned by Washington officials.

No marked changes in the battle line in France and Belgium are indicated by the latest official reports. The German claim progress at several points in the extreme west, notably near Ypres, where they are trying to break through to reach Calais, but the French say there is nothing new to report in the operations north of the River Lys. Petrograd claims continued success in the Caucasus south of the Vistula, while Germany says conditions in these regions are unchanged.

Russia still contends that her troops are vigorously defeating the Turks, but the Ottoman government contradicts this and declares that its forces are the victor in the engagements that have occurred thus far.
