FLORIDA VEGETABLES FIGURE IN KANSAS CITY COURT.

As Evidence in Behalf of Man Accused of Fraud in Selling Lands. Kansas City, Mo., Nov. 23.—Fruits and vegetables grown on Florida Everglades land were brought into the federal court here today as evidence on behalf of E. C. Chambers and four others accused of fraud in selling Florida farms.

Calahan, a Florida farmer whose land is near Miami, Fla., and O. G. Barkley of Hope City, Fla., the juror who presided over the trial, brought in samples of their produce. Calahan and he showed them oats, wheat, alfalfa, corn, barley, rice, grapefruit, lemons and sweet potatoes which he had grown, without fertilizer on his everglades farm this year.

Calahan said, on cross examination, that his farm was used as a show place for visitors to the Everglades and that it was on the edge of Lake Okechobee and situated on a much larger amount of mineral matter in the soil than land further down the Everglades.

Barkley, who brought a nine pound sweet potato to the stand among other produce, said on cross examination that he had been associated with Chambers in the sale of Florida land and that he was one of those arrested with him.

Present information has led the board to believe that there is about \$200,000,000 of surplus reserve in member banks in the north and east. They fear that a lower rate of re-discount would result in an exportation of gold, which they do not want at this time.

BLUEJACKETS IN UNIFORM WERE REFUSED ADMISSION. Secretary Daniels to Investigate Action of a Washington Theatre.

Washington, Nov. 23.—Investigation of the refusal of doorkeepers at a local theatre to admit bluejackets in uniform last Saturday night has been ordered by Secretary Daniels. He directed Solicitor Edgerton of the navy department to determine whether there was basis for legal action.

CARGOES OF COPPER HELD UP BY GREAT BRITAIN. Necessary to Prove It Was Destined to Belligerent Nation.

Washington, Nov. 23.—To maintain successfully her right in seized or detained cargoes of American copper carried on an American or other neutral vessel to a neutral country, such as Spain, in the south or Holland in the north of Europe, Great Britain apparently finds it necessary to establish the probability that copper actually is destined for Germany, Austria or even Turkey.
