TROLLEY WORK CAR STRUCK AUTO

Four Occupants of Machine Thrown Out at Lord's Corners — A. B. Swain of Clinton Received Cuts About the Face and Head—Accident Happened at Bad Curve.

A. B. Swain of Clinton, secretary of the Guilford and Clinton Water Co., his wife, and two other women in his automobile were all injured Monday morning at 10:45 o'clock when the Swain automobile was struck by the Shore Line Electric railway Co. work train on the common about two miles from Saybrook.
