Experiences in Belgium. The following letter has been received by Sergt.-Major Morgan, of the G. G. F. G., from Capt. A. G. Turner, 2nd Batt., 1st Canadian Division.

After we left Ypres there were many small incidents until we were in action near LaBassee in a place where there had been much severe fighting.

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at a spot that had not been shelled before and well hidden from the enemy by a ridge and wood, the 13th Battalion was waiting for the G. G. G. limber a mile behind our own firing line.

"Frequently the brigade will establish headquarters at night and previously shelled. Inside twelve hours they have the place spotted and the enemy's position is known.

On two occasions we were found running through our lines forward. The last one through the LaBassee canal.
