THE MEXICAN APPEAL

Many suggestions have been made to Mexico under the belief that it would accept the good and well-intended advice of a friendly nation. The manner in which it has been accepted indicates that the people who are in control of factional affairs in that republic and the manner in which they view the interest which other countries are taking in their affairs.

Just how much different the latest communication to the Mexican leaders as drafted and despatched by the representatives of several countries of North, South and Central America will be received remains to be seen. There are hopes that it will make an impression that will bring results, but there appears to be no other basis for the belief that Carranza cannot resist the appeal. His, as well as others, have steadfastly done so before, and his power at home appears to be greater today than for a long time previous.

NEW PETTICOATS

The phases of the new petticoat are many. We have princess slips of silk, batiste, crepe de chine, made over the shoulders with straps of ribbon and elaborately trimmed about the hem with wide French lace, pleated organdie, chiffon or net, caught here and there with bouquets of delicately tinted French flowers. They measure from four to six yards about the hem, and sometimes little 1845 pantalettes, made of materials to match the petticoat, are worn beneath.

TO CLEAN LEATHER

Leather chairs often become greasy looking where the arms and head rest are. To remove these marks, take a half pint of linsaid and add a stand till nearly cold. Then pour in half pint of vinegar, stir till it is well mixed, and rub with a clean cloth.

PAINT FLOWER POTTS

Instead of buying expensive jardiniere for your plants, paint the ordinary flower pots and saucers with an oil paint to harmonize with the color scheme of the room.

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TO SHRINK GINGHAM

To shrink gingham lay the cloth in a large tub of lukewarm rain water, to which a handful of salt has been added, taking care to place the cloth in the original folds. Let it soak until the material is thoroughly wet through, then remove from the tub and, without wringing, pin to a line in the open air. It will dry perfectly smooth and the color will not run.

NEEDLEWORK NOTES

When working buttonholes on bias material or goods which ravel first starch the material stiff and then iron dry. The material will then neither stretch nor ravel.

HEALTH AND BEAUTY

A warm bath at night and a tepid or slightly hot bath or douche in the morning makes an ideal combination for many people.

IF MOTHS IN THE CARPET

If you fear moths in carpets or rugs, scrub the floor with strong hot water and when sweeping the rugs each week, or the carpet, sprinkle the first with salt and sweep the treatment could hardly be applied to a nicely finished floor, but moth repellent can be applied to the carpet or waxed hardwood floor.

WINDOW CLEANING

One quart denatured alcohol added to three quarts water; stir in enough sugar to make it of the consistency of thin cream; apply to windows or mirrors with cloth or sponge; let it dry and rub off with a clean cloth.

TO AVOID SCALDING STEAM

When turning boiling water from a kettle into the sink, run cold water at the same time, then there is no danger of the hands being scalded from the steam.

STENCILING CURTAINS

When stenciling curtains make the colors a little darker than you wish them to appear. When hung at the windows the colors seem lighter than they really are.

CONCERNING WOMEN

The German government has prohibited housewives from making any more pastry until after the war is over. Due to the fact that the supply of flour is not enough to make anything but the most limited supply.

GOOD CARPET SOAP

Three small bars of good white soap, three gallons of water, one 10-cent bottle of household ammonia, one-half box of borax and 10 cents worth of tartar. Melt soap in water on top of stove, then add other ingredients. Let boil ten minutes, then take off stove. Splendid for renewing colors and cleaning them from fleety. Will keep indefinitely.

PREVENT SCORCHING

When meats are being roasted and there is danger of their becoming too brown, place a basin of water in the oven. The steam will prevent scorching and the meat will cook better.

three cores, wide enough to give free action.
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Good desserts for this season of the year may be had by making nuts, fresh fruits and marshmallows, all cut fine. These should be served cold in sherbet cups with whipped cream on top.

SALT FOR BATHTUB

A new way to clean porcelain bathtubs is by putting a little coarse salt into the dampened tub and then rubbing it briskly with a rag wet with turpentine.

RECIPES

Suet Pudding—One cup molasses, one cup of milk, one cup chopped suet, one cup raisins, three and one-half cups flour, one teaspoon saleratus, one tablespoon sugar, one teaspoon cloves, one teaspoon mace, one teaspoon allspice and one of grated nutmeg; beat the molasses, sugar, raisins and spice to a froth, then stir in the milk in which dissolve the saleratus and add the flour; steam five hours or more; serve with any good sauce.

Steamed Bread Pudding—Soak two slices of stale bread in three cups of milk for one hour; then add two well-beaten eggs, one teaspoon salt, a little cinnamon, clove, allspice and nutmeg to taste; a piece of butter the size of a walnut; put in the upper part of a steamer and steam over hot water for one hour; add raisins or cocoanut, whichever is preferred, and serve with whipped cream flavored with vanilla.

Nothing is to be written on this card with the exception of the date and the name of the sender. The phrases which are not used may be crossed out, if anything else is added the card will be destroyed.
To eliminate delay the correspondence for prisoners of war must be written in English and on postal cards. I am feeling very well. I have been sent to the hospital. (and I am quite well). (and I hope to be released soon). I have received your letter, tele-gram, postcard. Letter will follow at the next opportunity. I have not received any letter from you recently. (for a long time). War Prisoner's Camp. Ahmednagar, India. Date
