The early beginning of the work of transforming the Thames river navy yard into a submarine station of great importance, as recommended by Secretary Daniels, is indicated in an advertisement for bids for dredging which will be received at the bureau of yards and docks of the navy department in Washington until 11 a. m. on Oct. 3.
