WILLIMANTIC OBITUARY. Edgar D. White.

Edgar D. White, 67 years of age and a prominent resident of Andover, died Wednesday afternoon at Dr. L. Mason's private hospital in this city, after an extended illness with a complication of diabetes.

He was born in Andover, February 20, 1848, the son of George H. and Lucia (Parker) White. He taught school in his native town in his youth and was later engaged in farming. At one time he was employed by the C. & N. Lumber company of this city.

He was a democrat in politics and held all the offices in the gift of the town of one time or another. He had been a deacon of the Andover Baptist church for twenty-five years or more. He is survived by his widow, Amanda, a daughter, Mrs. Edith B. Maxwell of Hartford, and a sister, Mrs. Adeline Burnham of Andover.
