YALE DUPLICATE 1910 FEAT? Princeton Eleven Not Discouraged by Crimson Victory and Will Meet Yale With Renewed Hopes—Tom Shevlin Has Better Material Than He Welded Into Shape Ten Years Ago—Blue-Tiger Game Promised to Be One of Clean-cut Football Tactics.

The effect of the Harvard victory upon the men of the Princeton squad and the tactics to be employed by the Princeton team are two elements which will figure largely in the winning or losing of this week's big game at the Yale bowl.

Confident of an equal claim with Cornell and Pittsburg for the championship of eastern football and sure of a victory over Harvard, the losing of last Saturday's game by Princeton is bound to have a cheering effect.

Other teams in Princeton's position have gone to pieces under such conditions and in games subsequent to a defeat. Forwarding and backward from everyone believed them capable, while an equal number has been striving to greater effort to take the lead.

The necessity of adopting tactics to meet situations was shown to great advantage in the Harvard-Princeton game of last week. Princeton, supporting it had a better punter than Harvard, started a kicking game, but uncovered failed when gains of only a few yards meant touchdowns and the winning of the game.

FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL STOCK PRICES FALL. Traders in General Were Active on the Short Side.

New York, Nov. 9.—The heavy liquidation which swept over yesterday's late market was renewed with greater vigor today, all parts of the list scoring new minimums for the current movement.

In fact, much of the day's unsettlement was caused by further pessimistic advices from abroad. These were largely upon political and financial conditions affecting the allied nations and were supplemented by unconfirmed rumors that large exporters were in danger of cancellation.

Some of the extreme declines were: Baldwin 23 at 140; Willys-Overland 20 at 140; American Locomotive 4 at 113; Tennessee Copper 5 at 51; and Great Northern 40 at 45.

Shares in the so-called "near" war class like American Lined common and preferred, United States Industrial Alcohol, Distillers Securities and American Coal Products lost 3 to 10 points.

Bonds advanced in sympathy, some speculative issues making appreciable declines. Total sales, par value, aggregated \$4,745,000.
